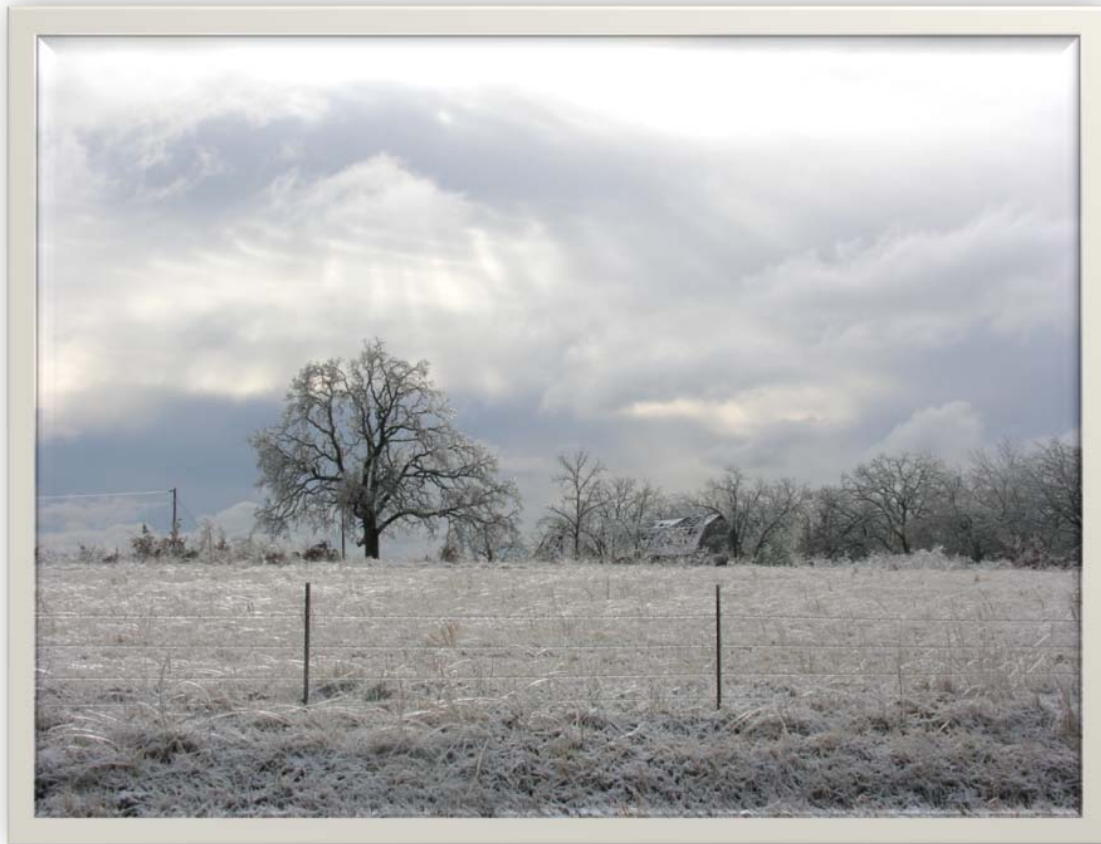

January

- 5) Then the Lord replied; “Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it.” Habakkuk 2:2

In him we have redemption through the blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding. – Ephesians 1:7-8

How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! – 1 John 3:1

When you think of February, you have to think of Valentine's Day and love. "God is love." "His love endures forever." "Who can separate us from the love of God?"

It is hard to be angry, hurt, nervous and anxious when you know you are completely loved and when love radiates from your heart. When you aren't feeling very lovable, know that you are loved by God.

1 John 3:1 doesn't just say that God loves us. It says, "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us." I just love that word lavish! These two verses use that word to get the point across.

To lavish means – to be extravagant, to literally squander or be wasteful.

As you begin the month of February, continue to know that every day, every moment is a new start and that God lavishes His love on you. Take some of that wasted love and give it back to others.

February

- 2) We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. – Romans 12:6
- 3) He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. – Isaiah 40:29
- 4) Listen to this, Job; stop and consider God's wonders. - Job 37:14
- 5) A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones. – Proverbs 17:22
- 6) The Lord will guide you always; he will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail. – Isaiah 58:11
- 7) Therefore I urge you to imitate me. - 1 Corinthians 4:16
- 8) For nothing is impossible with God. – Luke 1:37
- 9) But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well. – Luke 12:31
- 10) And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. - Romans 8:28
- 11) He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. – John 15:2
- 12) If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. – 1 Corinthians 13:1
- 13) Love is patient, love is kind. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. – 1 Corinthians 13: 4 & 7
- 14) Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.

- 15) This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. – 1 John 1:5
- 16) And that you may love the Lord your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. For the Lord is your life, and he will give you many years in the land he swore to give to your fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. – Deuteronomy 30:20
- 17) Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. – James 1:22
- 18) Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within. – John 7:38
- 19) He answered; “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind,” and, “Love your neighbor as yourself.” – Luke 10:27
- 20) Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! – Philippians 4:4
- 21) The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not be in want. – Psalm 23:1
- 22) In his heart a man plans his course, but the Lord determines his steps. – Proverbs 16:9

I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. – John 15:1

March begins the start of new life. A full-blown spring is just around the corner. There are many references in the Bible about growth. We are told to bear fruit, that we will be known by the fruit we produce, to be rooted, there is a season for every activity, and that we are born not of perishable seed.

Continue on a path of spiritual growth. Know that God is the gardener taking care of you. Also know that growth doesn't happen over night. You can't plant an Oak tree and rush the process. The growth is happening under the ground where it can't be seen. A strong foundation is being developed to support the future growth which will break forward for all to see. Oak trees also have firm, sturdy trunks and a good limb structure. This foundation of steady and solid growth allows the Oak tree to weather the winds and storms.

We live in a society where we want everything instantly. If you are familiar with a Bradford Pear tree, they are beautiful, symmetrical trees that grow very quickly. While these trees are beautiful on the outside, their growth structure provides the opposite stability of an Oak tree. The massive limbs and shallower roots make the Bradford Pear tree the first tree to be blown over in a severe thunderstorm. Plus, the life span of a Bradford Pear tree is only twenty five years, while an Oak tree can live for centuries.

Don't model yourself after the Bradford Pear, be a firm tree like an Oak. Then you can weather the storms that will come throughout your life. True growth doesn't happen overnight. Be faithful every day to root yourself in God's promises and love for you.

- 9) And put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth. – Ephesians 4:24
- 10) But the noble man devises noble plans; and by noble plans he stands.
– Isaiah 32:8
- 11) I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing. – John 15:5
- 12) So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith. – Galatians 6:10
- 13) I will not leave you as orphans; I will come for you. – John 14:18
- 14) Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. – Romans 12:21

- 15) Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. – Romans 15:13
- 16) Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. – Psalm 119:105
- 17) The way of the righteous is smooth; O Upright One, make the path of the righteous level. – Isaiah 26:7
- 18) I waited patiently for the Lord; and He inclined to me and heard my cry.
– Psalm 40:1
- 19) God saw all that he had made, and it was good. – Genesis 1:31
- 20) There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves punishment, and the one who fears is not perfected in love. – 1 John 4:18

- 24) Looking at them, Jesus said, "With people it is impossible, but not with God; for all things are possible with God." – Mark 10:27
- 25) But now, O Lord, You are our Father, we are the clay, and You our potter; and all of us are the work of Your hand. – Isaiah 64:8
- 26) I will give thanks to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; wonderful are Your works, and my soul knows it very well. – Psalm 139:14
- 27) For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body.
– 1 Corinthians 6:20
- 28) Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. – Matthew 7:24
- 29) Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my anxious thoughts.

30) Seek the Lord while He may be found; call upon Him while He is near.

Another elaborated version of the Bible verse above is found in the book of Luke, chapter 12 and verses 27 and 28.

"Consider how the lilies grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today, and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, how much more will he clothe you, O you of little faith!"

April also means the richness of spring. Many times Easter falls in this month. Jesus Christ represents the quintessential definition of new life.

Pay attention to all of the wonders of nature and the new life that is popping up all around you. Continue to renew yourself each day and to rest in the fact that you are being cared for.

April

- 1) The way of a fool seems right to him, but a wise man listens to advice.

- 10) He who walks with wise men will be wise, but the companion of fools will suffer
harm. – Proverbs 13:20
- 11) No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and God is
faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but
with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be
able to endure it. – 1 Corinthians 10:13
- 12) For His anger is but for a moment, His favor is for a lifetime; weeping may last
for the night, but a shout of joy comes in the morning. – Psalm 30:5

- 13) And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ. – Ephesians 3:17-18
- 14) Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men. – Colossians 3:23
- 15) Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you. – 1 Peter 5:7
- 16) And who of you by being worried can add a single day to his life? – Matthew 10:19
- 17) There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven. – Ecclesiastes 3:1
- 18) Apply your heart to instruction and your ears to words of knowledge. – Proverbs 23:12
- 19) The unfolding of your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple. – Psalm 119:130
- 20) For the earth is the Lord's, and, everything in it. – 1 Corinthians 10:26
- 21) For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth; and the former things will not be remembered or come to mind. – Isaiah 65:17
- 22) Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. – Romans 5:1-2
- 23) Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. – Romans 5:3-4
- 24) Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest secure. – Psalm 16:9
- 25) Delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart. – Psalm 37:4
- 26) Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life. – Proverbs 4:23
- 27) As water reflects a face, so a man's heart reflects the man. – Proverbs 27:19

- 28) So we say with confidence, the Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me? – Hebrews 13:6
- 29) It is good to praise the Lord and make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your love in the morning and your faithfulness at night.
- Psalm 92 1-2
- 30) For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. – Romans 15:5

Every good thing given and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shifting shadow.

– James 1:17

There are many references in the Bible regarding light. 1 John 1:5 states, "God is light; in him is no darkness at all." This verse assures us of two things - we can see clearly that every perfect gift comes from God because He is light, and - God never changes.

As spring moves into summer, we enjoy more light each day. It's hard to see anything in the dark. It's hard to know where to walk in the dark. God's light lights our path.

As Christians, we also are light. Matthew 5:14-16 says, "You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."

As you continue on building a closer relationship with God, don't keep your light hidden. Think of ways to be of service and let your light shine.

- 12) No one lights a lamp and puts it in a place where it will be hidden, or under a bowl. Instead he puts it on its stand, so that those who come in may see the light. – Luke 11:33

- 13) We urge you, brethren, admonish the unruly, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with everyone. – 1 Thessalonians 5:14
- 14) But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it. – Romans 8:25
- 15) And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit. – Ephesians 3:17-18
- 16) Finally, brethren, rejoice, be made complete, be comforted, be like-minded, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.
– 2 Corinthians 13:11
- 17) Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us. – Hebrews 12:1

Be still and know that I am God. – Psalm 46:10

We live in a noisy world. If you live in a city, there are loud sounds of constant traffic, sirens, blaring train horns, and the roar of airplane engines overhead. Computers, televisions, cell phones, personal electronic devices bombard our senses. Some people can't tolerate silence. Each moment has to be filled with some kind of noise. Many people are afraid of silence. If there is a lull in a conversation, it becomes awkward and someone will begin to speak to fill in the gap. Don't let that be you.

How much of our relationship with God is one-sided, meaning, who's doing all of the talking? Even though prayer is important in a spiritual life, how often do we listen? While the Bible talks about asking, it also talks about being still. How often are we silent? Some of the most profound insights can come when being silent.

If you don't meditate on a regular basis, I urge you to try being still. Feel the presence of God by retreating to a quiet place.

Getting quiet will renew your body and spirit and will draw you closer to God. God speaks to us in the stillness. Be still.

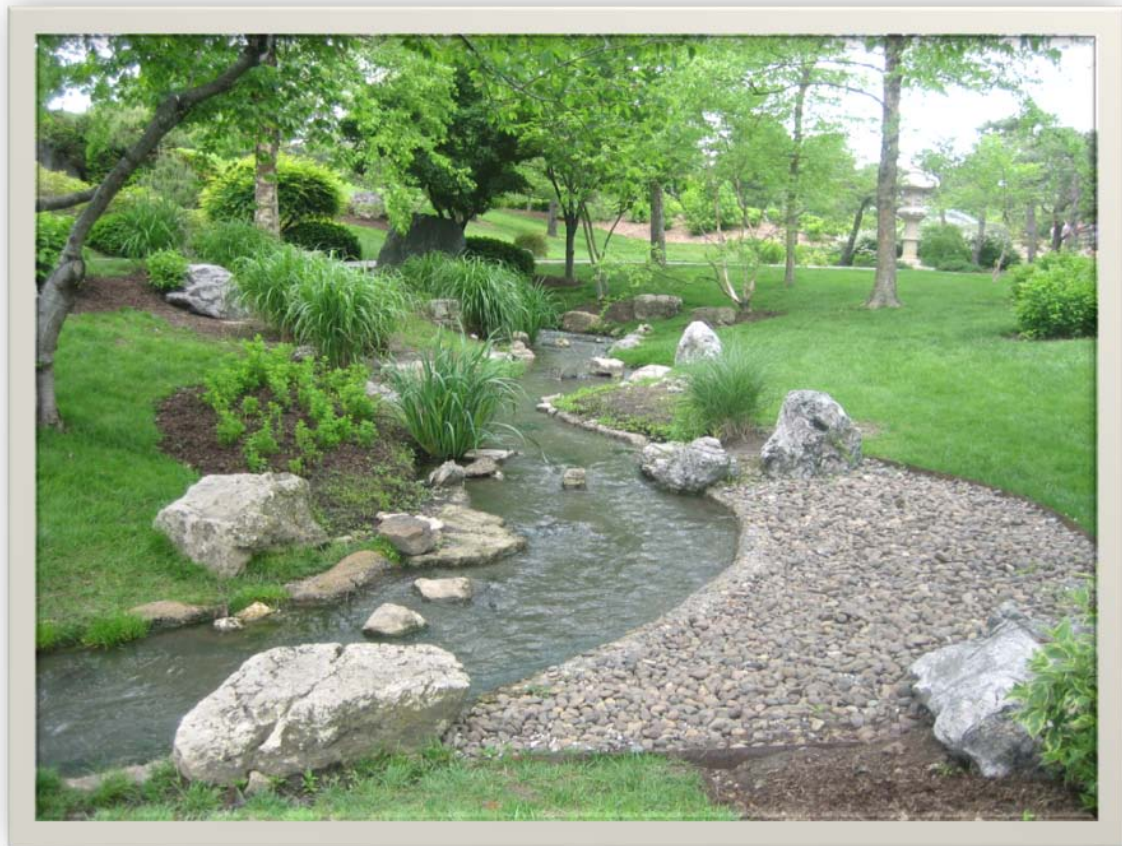

We all desire to be comfortable. It's when we become too comfortable, however, that we start to have problems. When we become too comfortable, we can become complacent. Relationships can start to break down because of neglect. The high emotions and excitement at the beginning can fade rapidly.

This can happen in our relationship with God too. How quick are we to beg for help, bargaining sometimes, yet days, weeks, months, or even years may go by without even acknowledging His presence.

Make a conscious effort to feel connected to God. Ask that your love for Him be renewed and deepened every day. Be aware that you are always connected to God's love. "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." – Romans 8:38

Persistence is the key to anything we do in life. Persistence is what it takes in having meaningful relationships. That includes our relationship with God.

We are God's children. Just like little children persist in getting what they want, we need to be persistent, as God's children, to seek His presence in our daily lives. As James states so eloquently in Chapter 4 verse 8: "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you."

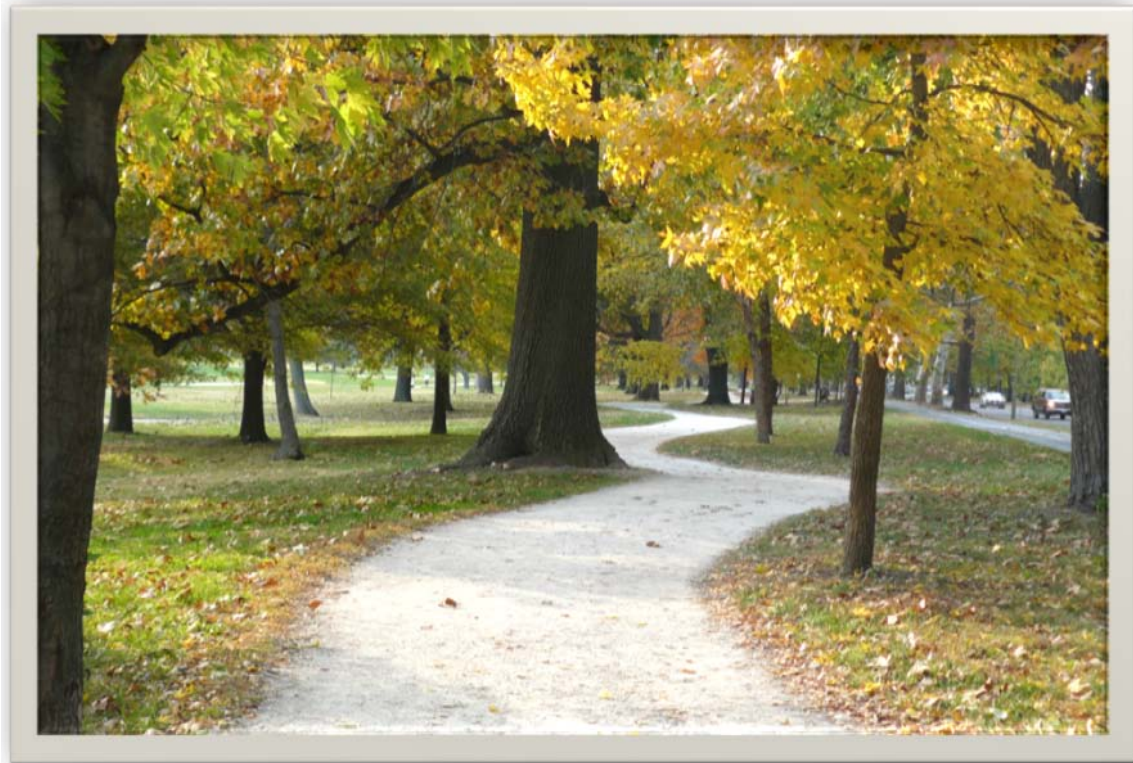

Direct me in the path of your commands, for there I find delight. – Psalm 119:35

Is God directing your path? I love the wisdom that I received from Pastor Ken Evitts whom I met at a Stephen Ministry Leadership conference.* We sat at the same table together. While I have been on my spiritual path, seeking, studying, meditating and learning; when the opportunity arises to be able to speak to a pastor, I always take advantage of it. After all, pastors spend years studying the Bible and leading through example.

My question to Pastor Ken was, "How do I know that I am on the right path?" His explanation to me was that being directed by God was like power steering in a car. In James 1:22 it says, "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."

He said that it was important to “do” because in the doing it meant moving. Power steering doesn’t work very well when a car isn’t moving. When a car is moving, however, the power steering kicks in and it’s very easy to steer the car in any direction. When we keep moving and ask God to direct us, He will steer us in the right direction.

So, keep seeking, doing and living your life, always asking for God to direct your path.

Attention was given to getting our own children raised and getting a respite so to speak from that challenge. Traditional, steady employment with promises of raises is no longer a guarantee. Aging brings on new health issues. Love relationships are lost and heartaches and disappointments can fill our lives.

But God is there through it all. All of our challenges, all of our burdens we can cast on Him.

Maybe life is good right now. November means the month of Thanksgiving. We give thanks for all that we have. Be thankful for the tough times that build our courage and make us stronger. Be thankful for the good times, because God is good.

- 26) For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. – Romans 8:15

- 27) Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for your brothers, love one another deeply, from the heart. For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God. – 1 Peter 1:22-23
- 28) But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it. – Matthew 7:14
- 29) For the Lamb in the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and will guide them to springs of the water of life; and God will wipe every tear from their eyes. – Revelation 7:17
- 30) Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God!
– Romans 11:33
- 31) The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.
– Numbers 6:24-26

As another year comes to an end, make a renewed commitment to continue a habit of journaling, prayer and meditation. Make these practices a part of your spiritual life, for the rest of your earthly life.
